



2026 Parkway Tree Replacement Program

Available species for spring planting

Accolade Elm



Strong, arched branching gives this large shade tree a sturdy, vase shaped growth habit. Fast growing as a young tree, reaching up to 60' in height with a spread of 40'. Remarkably dark green and glossy foliage with yellow fall color. Disease and pest resistant as well as drought tolerant.

Autumn Gold Ginkgo



A male, fruitless variety that is pest resistant and widely adaptable to urban conditions. Narrow form in youth broadens with age, maturing to a height of 45' and a spread of 35'. Outstanding yellow fall color.

Cornelian-cherry Dogwood



Similar in size (mature height of 20-25', spread of 15-20') and shape to a crabapple. One of the first trees to flower in the spring, with clusters of small star-shaped yellow flowers covering the trees before leaves emerge. Glossy dark green foliage appears in summer, followed closely by dark red fruits that ripen in July. Reddish purple fall color.

Espresso Kentucky Coffee Tree



The huge doubly compound leaves give this tree a tropical feel, and the arching branches present an elm-like form. This is a male variety; therefore, it does not have seed pods. Yellow fall color. Mature height is 50' with a spread of 35'. Good tolerance of heat, drought, and cold.
(These trees are 1.75-2" in diameter)

Exclamation London Planetree



A strong central leader, upright pyramidal shape, and dense branching make this an easy, fast growing tree. Its mature height is 55' with a spread of 35'. It is tolerant of difficult urban conditions and resistant to anthracnose and frost cracking. Exfoliating brown and cream bark is another interest of this tree.

Hackberry



A tough native tree that is tolerant of climatic conditions and urban abuse. Reaches a height of 45'. Light green leaves fade to yellow in fall. Rough, corky bark adds interest and resists damage.

Japanese Tree Lilac



A smaller sized tree that reaches a height and spread of 20'. It produces large clusters of creamy white, fragrant flowers in late spring, early summer. Drought resistant.

Marmo Maple



'Marmo' was selected from the collections of the Morton Arboretum. Characteristics include a vigorous growth rate, a strong central leader, excellent branching character, and a uniform upright habit. Also seedless and resistant to frost cracking. Fall color is an interesting mottled blend, ranging from combinations of red and green to burgundy, yellow, and gold, depending on temperature changes and site conditions. Mature height of 55' and 45' spread.

Shawnee Brave Bald Cypress



This unique parkway tree is a deciduous conifer, meaning it has green needles that turn rusty orange and drop off the tree in fall. With a narrowly pyramidal habit, it reaches a height of 55' and 20' wide. Proven to be widely adaptable to city conditions, it will grow in standing water or in well drained soils.

Sterling Silver Linden



A vigorous growing tree with a very neat and symmetrical shape. Leaves are green with silver-gray underside. They are also tomentose (hairy), which make them resistant to Japanese beetle feeding. Yellow fall color. Mature height of 45' and spread of 35'.

Swamp White Oak



A beautiful native shade tree with lustrous, heavy textured green leaves. Maximum height and spread of 45' with a rounded, open form. Adaptable to wet, poorly drained soils and tolerance of drought. Yellowish brown to reddish fall color. (These trees are 1.75-2" in diameter)

Tulip Tree



A large, fast growing tree, native to the eastern U.S. It flowers in late spring to early summer. Flowers are large, yellow-green with an orange center, and their shape resembles that of a tulip. Deep green, glossy leaves give way to yellow in the fall. Mature height of 55' and 25' wide.

White Shield Osage Orange



This incredibly tough Midwest native is both thornless and fruitless. Heat and drought tolerant and has remarkable dark green, glossy foliage that turns yellow in the fall. Grows 35' high and wide and is fast-growing.
